Youth and Children: Post 217 has sponsored a new program titled "4th Grade Flag Education Program" which consisted of working in coordination with 4th grade teachers in our local schools. With this program, the students are provided with a comic book "Flag of Our Country." After an opportunity to read and study the book, they were given a 20question test. Once we have all tests graded, the top boy and girl who placed the highest score will receive an award and advance to County, if top score there will advance to 2nd District. Thank you Mr. New (Hardin-Houston) and Mrs. Mays (Christian Academy) for allowing us to provide this educational opportunity to your 4th Grade Students.

Americanism and Government Testing: Post 217 will be administering the test to students in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 beginning early November. Grades 9 will take the test as practice for next year. It is comprised of a 50question test in addition to a 300-word essay. There are 4 judging levels, Post, County, District, and State. Only 18 final winners will be selected at State. The winners will receive an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C. with the highlight of the trip being a Wreath Laying at the Tomb of the Unknowns at Arlington Cemetery. What an outstanding opportunity to show our support. This year, Christian Academy, Hardin-Houston, and Sidney High School have volunteered to participate in this valuable program.

American Legion Buckeye Boys State: Buckeye Boys State will be held at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, June 8-15, 2025. At Boys State, participants learn the rights, privileges, and responsibilities of franchised citizens. The training is objective and centers on the structure of city, county, and state governments. Operated by students elected to various offices, Boys State activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, lawenforcement presentations, assemblies. bands, choruses, and recreational programs. If you know a junior in high school who would be an excellent delegate, please refer them to their school who in turn will submit a list of eligible candidates to Post 217. The post will then conduct interviews and select our representative(s) for the program. We will be sponsoring 6 delegates for 2025 in memory of Steve Peltier. So why should I renew my American Legion Membership or invite veterans who are eligible but are not members to join? There are many reasons, some are personal reasons for each veteran, and other reasons are because of our desire to help our brother and sister veterans or to help the needs in our communities.

Some of the local programs that Post 217 is "Sidney involved with are: Veterans Association Honor Guard": What better way to volunteer only a couple of hours a week and some weeks no time at all is needed to honor our departed Brother and Sister veterans on their final journey. "Boys State" – Select high school Junior boys are given the opportunity to learn how our government operates by spending a week during the summer at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio learning about the operation of our government, from local government to state government. Our Boys State Volunteers will spend the week with the students at Miami University and assist with the programs.

Additionally, we participate in the Americanism and Government Program offered to ninth through 12 graders at local schools. This consists of a 50-question test. At the August 2024 American Legion National Convention in New Orleans, Ohio was designated first in the nation for Americanism! This strongly shows the dedication and leadership of all involved with administering and preparing our students for these worthwhile programs. Great job everyone.

"Gifts for Yanks" Lead or help with our annual fund raising for our veterans who are living in veteran homes. Many of these veterans need daily living supplies and have little or no family to help them. FROM THE TRUSTEES

Dear Fellow Veterans, Family, and Friends,

Hopefully, everyone is doing great!

We have many things going on at the Legion Building. The Eternal Flame light should be functioning by the time you receive this newsletter. Metal attachments will be added to seal the area where it is connected to the

concrete base, this will prevent any water damage. Placement of brick pavers will be on hold for the winter as we need to put sand between and seal the ones already in place. We are so thankful to the many Donors and those purchasing the brick pavers. We have two more 2' x 2' Donor granite pavers to be placed. We have 3 more that have not been etched. If you would like to donate, please let us know.

The trustees voted to install electricity to the Gazebo, to lights to shine on the Eternal Flame, and lights to showcase the Veteran Memorial Park sign. The sign will be 4' x 6' and placed midway between the Gazebo and the walkway to the Eternal Flame. We will build a retaining wall at the base of the sign. The materials for the sign are being donated by Quality Steel Fabrications except for painting of the American Flag. The Eagle Scout Project for placement of the VFW War Medallion display is currently in progress and hopefully to be completed soon. The previous dirt mounds have been leveled; however, more dirt still needs to be obtained, then planting of grass seed. Thank you for everyone's patience as we work towards the completion of this project.

We have hired TICON (who originally completed our parking lot paving) to seal some minor cracks in the parking lot to prevent further damage during the winter months with freezing, thawing, and creating potholes. We have 12 parking blocks and 4 handicapped signs to install in front of the Park after the dirt is leveled. These parking spaces will be striped next Spring. We will focus on revising the Memorial located left of the entrance driveway, perhaps next Spring if we do not have enough time to complete this year. Volunteers would be greatly appreciated as any of our projects would go much quicker. If you are interested in volunteering, please reach out to me.

We are thankful to all our Veterans for all they do, God Bless Them. They do things most do not realize they do. Sadly, a lot of the times,

it's the <u>same</u> people. We understand everyone has family and work obligations, but if you can find even a couple of hours a month, it would be extremely helpful.

Thanks to an anonymous donor and volunteers, we have a new Gazebo on the back patio area. The wooden picnic table has a facelift with all new boards. We have sealed the wood on the large Gazebo in the Memorial Park. Hook Remodeling will be working on the American Legion sign on the front of the building as it is beginning to come unattached. They will also repair the door frames where there is damaged material from swinging open during excessive winds.

The flooring in the Canteen is coming loose and posing a safety issue. The Veterans Association is aware.

We are obtaining several bids should we decide to have carpet placed in this area. If you have any suggestions on how to fix this issue, please let us know.

New flags have been raised in the Memorial Park, thank you to all who helped. We still have 3 park benches for sale, \$750 each. This includes a plaque designating who donated. We have hopes to purchase 2 more benches for the front of the building.

A more humbling note. We are so thankful to our veterans who signed on the dotted line to give their all. God Bless You! Thank you for your service. However, we could not have done it without the support of our Family and Friends back home. We salute you. Also, please give a moment of silence for all veterans who are alone, who gave their lives or were injured, who suffer from PTSD, and those still missing in Action/POW. My heart aches for their Family and Friends. Thankful for those serving now. God Bless and Prayers.

Now on to the next, I am so thankful for our Great Country and for all the blessings we have. May God always watch out for and bless our country. Merry Christmas to all, this is the one I can spell. I realize there are many
