I am searching for info concerning possible interest from children (local children of veterans, friends, neighbors, or grandchildren) that might be interested in joining an Air Rifle Club. I am also looking for veterans to become involved with our many volunteer programs. If you know of anyone who may be interested, please ask them contact me directly, by e-mail, at Americanlegion217@gmail.com, I would like to find a few young veterans or sons of the American Legion who would be interested in putting together a youth air rifle club and running the program. The American Legion Air rifle program is open to both boys and girls from around the area who are under 18 years old or up to a Senior in High School. You do not need to have a parent or relative who is an American Legion member or veteran.

This is a gun safety education marksmanship program that encompasses the basic elements of safety, enjoyment, and competition. Competitive shooting is a sport that creates a level playing field for both boys and girls to compete against each other. The program also teaches other skills for the youth that will help them through their developing years. It develops discipline, enhanced concentration, focus, and sportsmanship. The program is competitive all the way up to the Olympics. Please read up about the sport online and see if this may be a program you feel could be helpful in our community. I would like to see this include our neighboring American Legion Posts also.

I would like to tell everyone about one of the benefits of being an American Legion member and becoming involved with our programs. When you become involved, you get to meet many new people who have many different experiences with the military and the VA. Often conversations come up and people learn about new programs being offered that previously prevented veterans from receiving health care from the VA. Hello Veterans, Family and Friends.

Hopefully, you are doing well. It has been a rough winter, but we will get through it, God willing. WOW!!!

Here is a recap of the projects since the last newsletter:

- 1) The new Hobart dishwasher was received and installed. What a difference it has made!
- 2) Fultz Flooring has completed the replacement of the flooring in the upper area of the Canteen. We apologize for the inconvenience during the installation process. However, we greatly appreciate everyone's patience and support as we continue to improve the facility.
- 3) Estimates are being obtained to install a ramp off the Patio door.
- 4) We are working to repair/reinforce selected gutter attachments that are falling down.
- 5) The trustees are researching door push bars to facilitate emergency exiting should one arise. This is not

- a mandatory fix. We want to improve evacuation quickly in case of a fire and keep our facility secure since we are a Private Club.
- 7) We researched estimates for installing handicapped door cost would openers. The be approximately \$25,000. This would require fundraising in order to support this project. If you are interested in donating or helping with a fundraiser, please let us know.

There are more projects coming in the Spring:

- We will be working diligently to complete the Memorial Park to hopefully have a dedication ceremony this year.
- 2) There are 3 park benches still available to be sold for \$750 each. The memorial plaque is included in the price. We would like to purchase two more benches for either side of the front of the building.
- 3) The Memorial located at facility entrance drive needs redone. It will have a light for all to see.
- 4) The Veteran Memorial Park sign is currently being created. Once completed and the weather has improved, it will be placed midway between the memorial bricks and the Gazebo. A brick retaining wall will surround the sign and it will have a light.
- 5) Veteran bricks are still available for purchase at \$50 each. There are granite sponsor pavers available should any business or individual want to donate to have their name displayed. We have the ability to purchase additional pavers if the need arises. So thankful for all who have already donated. God Bless You!
- 8) The Eagle Scout Project is still in progress, Aiden Lee, Troop 95, has a retainer wall in place, and the war medallion is displayed inside the retainer wall.

- There will be handicapped parking spaces next to the Park with parking pavement stripes. Grass to be sowed in the Park.
- 10)We are considering a Garage Sale or Auction to dispense of items/equipment no longer needed in order to better organize the storage areas.
- 11) There is still painting of certain areas to be completed. Please volunteer so others who continually volunteer do not have to do it by themselves.

If you need or have any suggestions, please let us know. We may not be able to do everything, but we will definitely bring before the membership and hopefully implement your suggestion.

We are in desperate need of Honor/Color Guard members. Several members are not physically capable of continuing to volunteer. We should have at least 13-15 members; we are now averaging 5-8. Seneca County has 18 to 20 members. How impressive it is when they honor their fallen veterans. You do not need to be present for every funeral, it is only a small amount of time to render honors to our veterans. Please consider volunteering so we can show our veteran families and friends that we really honor our fellow veterans.
